- 4.1 Canned petfood of animal origin, exported into the Russian Federation was manufactured by establishments, approved or registered by the Competent authority in the EU Member State for delivery of goods for export and are under regular control from this Authority.
- 4.2 Canned petfood originates from processing establishments which are not under animal health restrictions.
- 4.3. Beef and mutton from which petfood is manufactured are derived from animals that originate from herds where there is no case of Bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) or scrapie and do not belong to birth cohorts of BSE positive animals. After slaughter bovine animals older than 30 or 48 months (underline the appropriate) depending on Member States² were tested, with negative results. Specified risk materials (SRM) were removed according to the OIE Code recommendations.
- 4.4 Canned petfood was obtained from raw materials of animal origin treated not lower than 133C° for the duration of not less than 20 minutes with the pressure of 3 Bars or the authorised alternative treatments applied under the supervision of a competent service of the EU Member State and gives the relevant warranty in relation to the established microbiological Standard.
- 4.5 The canning process includes a heat treatment at 121° C for 3 minutes or equivalent time temperature treatment in hermetically sealed container. This treatment eliminates Clostridium botulinum toxin and ensures a total bacterial count of less than 10 colony-forming units (cfu)/g, and absence of Salmonella and Enterobacteriaceae (sampling plan: absence in 25 g).
- 4.6 Canned petfood has undergone all precautions to avoid contamination with pathogenic agents after treatment.
- 4.7 Packing material is used for the first time and satisfies the necessary hygienic requirements.
- 4.8 -Canned/dry petfood of animal origin is legibly labelled on package.
- 4.9 Means of transport are treated and prepared in accordance with the rules approved in the EU.
